Purpose of This Lesson

In this lesson, you will learn how to:

- design your own lesson plan using WILOS360
- apply the six pedagogical phases in practice
- adapt lesson plans to your subject and students
- use 360° cultural content meaningfully





From Structure to Practice

You have already explored the
WILOS360 lesson plan structure.

Now you will:

- move from theory to practice
- design a lesson step by step
- focus on pedagogy rather than technology





Step 1 – Choose the Cultural Content

Select a 360° cultural event from WILOS360.

Consider:

- relevance to your subject
- age appropriateness
- potential for discussion and reflection





Step 2 – Define Learning Objectives

Clearly define what students should learn.
Objectives should:

- be clear and realistic
- focus on knowledge, skills, and attitudes
- align with curriculum goals





Step 3 – Know Your Learners

Think about your students.

Consider:

- age group
- prior knowledge
- language level
- learning needs and diversity





Step 4 – Plan the Six Pedagogical Phases

Structure your lesson using:

- Motivate
- Activate
- Explore
- Structure
- Apply
- Conclude



Motivate & Activate



- Motivate:
 - introduce the cultural context
 - spark curiosity

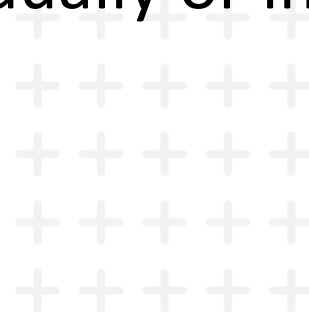
- Activate:
 - connect with prior knowledge
 - encourage initial discussion





Explore

- Explore the 360° content.
- Students:
 - observe actively
 - ask questions
 - work individually or in groups





Structure

- Help students organize learning.
- You may:
 - introduce new concepts or language
 - clarify observations
 - link activities to objectives





Apply

- Students apply learning.
- Activities may include:
 - projects
 - creative tasks
 - real-life connections





Conclude

- End the lesson with reflection.
- Students:
 - summarise learning
 - reflect on the process
 - self-assess or give feedback





Planning Worksheets and Assessment



Decide how learning will be supported and assessed.

Consider:

- worksheets or guiding questions
- observation and discussion
- reflection activities





Attention to Diversity

Adapt your lesson for all learners.

You may:

- offer differentiated tasks
- use flexible grouping
- provide additional support
